Nord Clergyman Will Conduct Week of Special Services

BAPTISM AT THE NIGHT SERVICE

Services in the Second Baptist Church, Ninth and Franklin streets, tomorrow will be of exceptional importance. The Rev. John Roach Stratton, D. D., of Baltimore, Md., will begin a series of evangelistic meetings, in co-operation with the minister of the church, the Rev. H. P. Holloway. The visiting preacher will preach in the morning and night services, and each night during the week, excepting Saturday. The preaching meetings on Sunday begin at 10:30 and 7:45 o'clock. The week-night meetings will begin at 8 o'clock.

At the evening meeting tomorrow night Mr. Holloway will again administer the ordinance of baptism. This will be the sixth Sunday in succession in which baptism has taken place.

Dr. Stratton is a preacher, lecturer, and former of prominence. He is a recognized authority in the matter of temperance reform and other uplift movements.

Dr. Stratton has successfully served the pastorate of the Second Baptist Church of Chicago, and the Seventh Baptist Church of Baltimore, Md., large churches of historic prominence.

The Bible school will be held at 2:15 o'clock. There are three adult classes for men and three for women.

The Senior Christian Endeavor Society will hold its weekly meeting at 6:45 o'clock in the chapel. The subject will be "The Consecration of Time." Sabbath observance meeting. George G. Penney, general superintendent of the Bible school will lead.
